II. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

III. ACCOUNTS PAYABLE OVER \$1,250 = \$51,461.89

Alderman Wilkins made the motion to approve the Accounts Payable over \$1250 in the amount of \$ 51,461.89. Alderman Hudson seconded the motion. On a call by the Mayor for ayes and nays, the motion passed unanimously.

IV. COMMENTS FROM CITIZENS

Dean Sharp of 714 S Porter addressed the council and spoke of his observations from Centralia citizens he had spoken with and praised the Centralia Police Department for their efforts in making this a safe community for its citizens and children. Sharp felt that the addition of the police dog to the force had been a great addition. Sharp also stated that by adding a working animal to the force, this is going to put fear into those coming to town for foul play. Sharp is proud to be living in Centralia. He asked for the continued backing of the Centralia Police Department.

Don Bormann of 800 Jason Ct. addressed the council on behalf of Lucille Ostmann of 802 S Jefferson. Bormann stated that Lucille had given the city easement on her property for the Safe Route to School Act and in the process of building the sidewalks, her monument marker had been removed. Bormann stated that Mrs. Ostmann spoken with City Administrator Harline and she felt she had no results and Bormann stated that he too had spoken with Harline and was here tonight because issue still not resolved. He was asking for the city to place the monument back where it belonged. Bormann was not insistent as to who does the work but that he was going to oversee that it was properly done as he had originally place the monument for Mrs. Ostmann. Bormann ask that the city cooperate and replace the monument as he felt that company working for the city had removed the monument. Bormann stated that this matter had been going on for sometime and nothing has been done to date and something needs to be done. Harline stated that MECO had pictures showing that the monument was not in place when they began the project. Harline stated he would put it back in if this was the request of the council. Aldermen Wilkins stated that it needs to be done. Aldermen Hudson stated that this is a "he said she said" situation and MECO had picture as proof that monument was not there when project began. Bormann stated that this was giving the city a black eye. Aldermen Hudson ask Bormann to let him finish his comment and then went on to state but that Ostmann had in good faith given easement to the city and felt that the city should put the monument back in but that it was in no way an admission that the City was at fault but felt this needed to be done in good faith for Ostmann. Hudson moved that we replace the monument. Aldermen agreed to just take care of it and no motion needed to be made.

1. Setting Compensation for Certain City Employees – Ordinance.

Bill No. 2218 Ordinance No. 2952

Alderman Rodgers presented a bill marked and designated as bill no. 2218 to create an ordinance entitled “**AN ORDINANCE SETTING COMPENSATION FOR CERTAIN CITY EMPLOYEES.**” Alderman Rodgers moved that it be placed on its first reading in entirety. Before the bill was introduced copies of the bill were made available for public inspection. Motion was seconded by Alderman Wilkins and motion carried unanimously. The bill was then read in its entirety. Alderman Rodgers moved the bill be placed on its second reading. Motion was seconded by Alderman Wilkins and motion carried unanimously. The bill was then read the second time in its entirety. The Mayor then called for discussion on the bill. No discussion. Alderman Rodgers moved the final passage of the bill. Alderman Wilkins seconded the motion. The Mayor called for a roll call vote and the ordinance passed with the following vote. Aldermen voting FOR: Lee, Magley, Rodgers, Wilkins & Hudson. Voting AGAINST: None. The Mayor declared the bill passed and thereupon signed the same as passed. The bill was approved by the Mayor and signed by the Mayor as approved and was returned to the Deputy City Clerk who attested to the signature of the Mayor, affixed the city seal and the Ordinance was designated as Ordinance 2932.

Authorizing the Mayor of Centralia, Missouri to enter into an Agreement for accepting certain items and donations – Ordinance.

Bill No .2219 Ordinance No. 2953

Alderman Rodgers presented a bill marked and designated as bill no. 2218 to create an ordinance entitled “**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF CENTRALIA, MISSOURI TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT FOR ACCEPTING CERTAIN ITEMS AND DONATIONS.**” Alderman Hudson moved that it be placed on its first reading in entirety. Before the bill was introduced copies of the bill were made available for public inspection. Motion was seconded by Alderman Wilkins and motion carried unanimously. The bill was then read in its entirety. Alderman Hudson moved the bill be placed on its second reading. Motion was seconded by Alderman Wilkins and motion carried unanimously. Harline worked with attorney meeting all requirements

Officer Brian Dulany gave a demonstration of Ranger’s training” Dulany and Ranger have had 12 weeks training. Aldermen had questions of Dulany of different training they have been through. Ranger then searched and found hidden drug for audience. Dulany stated that they would continue training and would be about 16 hours a month training (4days).

The patrol car was received on Thursday and Officer Dulany spoke of the many monitoring devices on the car for the protection of the dog in extreme weather conditions. Boyd Harris asked about the handling of the police dog around children. Officer Dulany spoke on this in depth. Ranger was totally green when they received him and they are extremely pleased with his progress as Dulany elaborated on the dog and the different training that Ranger has been engaged in. Chief Dudgeon commented on the commitment of Dulany and Kribbs for their training with Ranger.

2. Authorizing the City of Centralia to pursue Community Development Block Grant funds for demolition of certain commercial properties – Resolution.

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Bill No. 2220 Resolution No. R 18-04

Harline stated that he has received signatures from all three property owners so that the CDBG can move forward at this time. Harline was confident that this was fundable project but the process will take some time to complete and will be funded through 2019 funds.

Alderman Wilkins presented a bill marked and designated as bill no. 2218 to create an ordinance entitled "AN RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF CENTRALIA TO PURSUE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT FUNDS FOR EMOLITION OF CERTAIN COMMERCIAL PROPERTIES" Alderman Wilkins moved that it be placed on its first reading in entirety. Before the bill was introduced copies of the bill were made available for public inspection. Motion was seconded by Alderman Lee and motion carried unanimously. The bill was then read in its entirety. Alderman Wilkins moved the bill be placed on its second reading. Motion was seconded by Alderman Lee and motion carried unanimously. The bill was then read the second time in its entirety. The Mayor then called for discussion on the bill and after some discussion Alderman Wilkins moved the final passage of the bill. Alderman Lee seconded the motion. The Mayor called for a roll call vote and the ordinance passed with the following vote. Aldermen voting FOR: Lee, Magley, Rodgers, Hudson, and Wilkins. Voting AGAINST: None. The Mayor declared The bill was approved by the Mayor and signed by the Mayor as approved and was returned to the Deputy City Clerk who attested to the signature of the Mayor, affixed the city seal and the Resolution was designated as Resolution R-18-04.

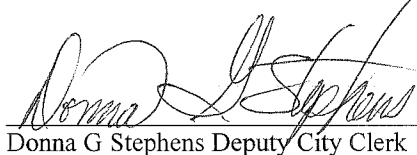
A. City Administrator's Monthly Report
