# STREET and SANITATION DEPARTMENT July 2017 Activity Report

- 1. Picked up bailed cardboard from businesses 3 times a week
- 2. Did 54 locates this month
- 3. Hauled off 2 loads of plastic to City of Columbia recycling facility
- 4. Picked up recycling at all 4 schools, city hall, and the Guard office several times this month
- 5. Hauled off 2 loads of recycling to City of Columbia recycling facility
- 6. Greased and cleaned up the loader and backhoe
- 7. Dug out and poured concrete to repair 7 street cuts on Green St.
- 8. Piled brush and grass and drop off site several times
- 9. Cut curb for sidewalk for new house on Adams st, and met with contractor to help with ADA sidewalk requirements
- 10. Spent several days hauling off brush and grass from drop off site to the landfill area
- 11. Spread 2 loads of rock on s. Columbia and bladed, and also bladed Ivy Lane, and then had dust control sprayed on both roads
- 12. Loaded a dump truck several times with compost
- 13. Mowed street ditches around town
- 14. Swept streets around town
- 15. Hauled off a large tree limb that fell and blocked Green St.
- 16. Put up a P&Z sign at 420 w. Singleton

Richard Dickerson sent an email (excerpts below) to ask permission to install a warning sign along the preferred route for the Centralia High School Cross-Country team.

"I need some advice on where to start with an idea to help protect our Cross Country and Track runners during practice on Gano-Chance Road. I have spoken with Coach Watermann and would like to install a couple of signs East of Cobblestone Lake Estates to caution traffic that runners are ahead.

The Cross Country Team practices on that hill a couple of times a week during the summer/fall and again in spring for Track. The sign I would like to erect would be a 24X18" like the one depicted [in the map enclosed in the packet].

On the map [enclosed] I have marked the location of an existing sign that notes the city limit and speed limit for Centralia. I propose mounting the "Runners" sign on the back of this existing sign and perhaps locating another post directly across the road on the North side of Gano Chance. I would have the signs made with a hinge and latch so that the signs may be "opened" during practice and then closed once practice is over. Thanks in advance for your consideration and advice. If I need to take this issue to the city council for approval I will be glad to do so at the next meeting since practice starts this week. I feel confident that Richman Graphics can have a sign made for me in short order...

### City staff is concerned about three things:

- 1. It would be a non-standard (not in conformance with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices) and could possibly slightly increase the City's liability in case anything would go wrong, since the City would be giving approval to the use of Gano Chance Road as a practice route for the cross-country team. Aside from being a non-standard shape and size, it would be placed on the opposite side of on-coming traffic. Finally, the City is acknowledging that there is a potential hazard.
- 2. The sign requires active maintenance opening & closing on a daily basis by CHS and putting it up and taking it down on an annual basis. If the sign is not open and closed, it increases the chance of "Visual fatigue" meaning that people would get used to the sign and no longer notice it. It is not certain how effective the sign would be in alerting drivers to the runners if the sign is opened and closed every time, but it would be less effective if it is not "posted" and removed when the runners are not practicing.

3. There would be no new law or enhanced penalty for the sign. In short it would not have any legal force behind it. The speed limit sets a legal limit for speed. No parking signs specify areas and times when parking is not allowed. Motorists are always required to be vigilant and to avoid hitting pedestrians, bicyclists and other slower and more vulnerable traffic. There is no special law for athletes in training, or even children.

Despite the objections, City staff will place the sign as requested by the school on a trial basis for one year. If the CHS cross-country team members and coaches keep the sign closed except when training, the City staff would be happy to cooperate. Staff will also work with CHS to seek alternate routes. Mr. Dickerson has been very willing to find the best alternative(s).

Action: If the Committee feels so inclined they may wish to make a motion "to direct staff to install the sign as designed at the beginning of the cross-country training session and remove shortly after the conclusion of the CHS cross-country season on a one-year trial basis."





I propose mounting the "Runners Ahead" sign on the back of the existing sign at the City Limit on East Gano Chance. I would have the sign made from aluminum with a stainless steel hinge and latch so they may be "opened" during practice and then closed once practice is over. The sign would be removed after the season is complete. Thanks in advance for your consideration and advice.

Re: Item VI-C-1: Sewer Services Outside the City limits



We have one customer who purchases sanitary sewer treatment services from the City but no other utilities. His property is outside the City limits on Route CC (see map), but right along the City's sanitary sewer line. This customer granted the City an easement to allow the construction of the sewer line in 2008. The City obtains water usage information from Water District #10 in order to bill this customer. Based on City Code, the rate is the same as for City residents (§26-125, 26-127).

As of the writing of this memo, the customer owes the City for about 20 months of service and a 5% penalty is applied each month after the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month. Typically this customer pays ahead on his account, and then the City deducts the bill each month until the account runs negative. He then pays ahead and so forth. The account has been running further behind each time. We have not charged a \$25 disconnect fee because we cannot disconnect service.

### Possible options:

- Work with the PWSD #10 to establish a water shut off agreement to be implemented if the account gets significantly behind (\$250 or so). Requires an agreement between the City and PWSD #10; not certain the legal options here or the amount of charge from the district
- Charge a disconnect fee (which just runs the account more negative) if the account runs a certain level behind. Provides incentive to stay current, but merely exacerbates the problem in the short term.
- Require the customer and any in the future to agree to pay via an ACH withdrawal by the City on a monthly basis. This requires the customer to provide us with banking information.
